A Pretesting nurse at **St. Joseph's Hospital** will call you on: **XXXXXX** so that you can be screened to make sure you are safe for anesthesia. Please do not delay your call as they may require additional testing and/or appointments that could result in your surgery being rescheduled if not done with enough time prior to your surgery. The Pretesting Nurse will tell you when to hold certain medications (i.e. blood pressure and diabetes medications)

IT IS THE PATIENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO CONTACT THE DOCTOR PRESCRIBING THE BELOW MEDICATIONS FOR PERMISSION TO STOP THEM BEFORE SURGERY (UNLESS DIRECTLY INSTRUCTED BY YOUR SURGEON THAT IT IS OK TO CONTINUE THE BLOOD THINNER)

<u>DRUG</u>	<u>HOW MANY DAYS TO HOLD PRIOR TO SURGERY</u>
Aspirin	7 Days
Plavix (Clopidogrel)	5 Days
Coumadin (Warfarin)	7 Days
Xarelto (Rivaroxaban)	3 Days
Eliquis (Apixaban)	3 Days
Pradaxa (Dabigatran)	3 Days
Brilinta (Ticagrelor)	7 Days
Motrin (Ibuprofen)	7 Days
Diclofenac, Aleve, Excedrin	7 Days
Effient (Prasugrel)	7 Days
Pletal (Cilostazol)	7 Days
Indomethacin	7 Days
Herbal Supplements (including but not limited to Fish Oil, Vitamin E)	7 Days

IF YOU ARE ON ANY BLOOD THINNER NOT ON THIS LIST PLEASE CALL OUR OFFICE TO CLARIFY WHEN TO STOP THE MEDICATION PRIOR TO SURGERY.

*****Be mindful that many over the counter medications include Aspirin and Ibuprofen*****

THE NIGHT BEFORE SURGERY: Per Anesthesia Do Not eat or drink anything after midnight the night before your surgery. However, you may be instructed to take a sip of water so that you may take certain medications. The Phone Assessment Nurse will review this with you.

THE DAY OF SURGERY: Go to the main entrance of St. Joseph's Hospital as the outpatient registration entrance is not available at this time due to construction.

- 1) Bring a government issued photo ID
- 2) Bring your health insurance card
- 3) Do NOT bring valuables or jewelry

PER HOSPITAL POLICY YOU WILL NEED SOMEONE TO DRIVE YOU HOME AND WATCH YOU AFTER YOUR SURGERY AND UBER/LYFT IS USUALLY **NOT** ACCEPTABLE

Please Note: This list is not all inclusive of entire preoperative scheduling process. The Surgery Schedulers will let you know if you need additional steps before your surgery such as: An Anesthesia or Cardiac Clearance or a visit to get blood or urine testing prior to your surgery.
